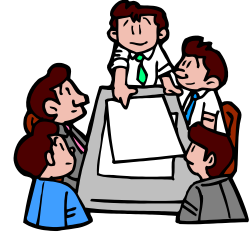

Things You Should Know...

↳ It's always fun to participate in programs with friends. If you are registering yourself or your child in a program, please talk with your friends ahead of time and remind them of the **registration night**. These registrations may prevent a program or two from being cancelled. Late registrations create additional work for volunteers and can make it difficult to size teams properly to allow for lots of playing time.

↳ **Safety** of all participants is our main concern. Supervision of all children and young people's activities is required in all areas of the school. In order to accomplish this, there will be **sign** up sheets posted at the registration tables for parents to sign up on a rotational basis.

↳ **Enrollment is limited** in some activities. Preference given to Lakeview residents.

↳ **A Lakeview Community Association (LCA) membership** is required to participate in any activity. Membership must be renewed every fall. The 2011/2012 fees are \$10 (family or individual). Other Community Association memberships are honoured.

↳ Many **activities have a minimum enrolment**. In the case of cancellation by LCA, registration fees will be refunded in full. If you cancel prior to the activity, a \$5 administration fee will be charged.

↳ Times, locations and fees are **subject to change** and must be confirmed on registration night. **Please note:** some times and locations listed in the City Leisure Guide may have been changed.

↳ No contact may be made between registration night and the start date. **Please note the starting date, time and location.**

↳ Black-soled shoes cannot be worn for gym activities. Floor hockey sticks must have plastic blades.

↳ **The LCA accepts Cash or Cheque only *****

↳ Activities will be cancelled on **statutory and school holidays**. Some classes may be rescheduled if schools are required for school activities.

↳ **Full payment** for activities is preferred on Registration Night. However, LCA will accept two-part payment with 1/2 paid on registration night and the balance by cheque post-dated, October 1, 2011.

↳ **How do you make sure you get into an activity? VOLUNTEER** to work at a Registration Night! Volunteers are allowed to sign up for activities prior to 7 pm. Contact Derrin Raffey by Aug 31, 2011.

↳ Late registration can only be made by contacting one of the coordinators. **Late registration fee is \$10.** **Note:** Activities may already be filled and your registration will not be accepted.

Soccer (U6, U8, U10)

Soccer is organized by the Saskatoon Youth Soccer Inc. (SYS) and is NON-COMPETITIVE and FUN. Emphasis is on learning and no standings are kept. A parent volunteer coaches the team. All coaches are invited to go through a SYS sponsored coaching clinic one evening at the end of September or beginning of October.

We rarely have an overabundance of coaches. If you are interested in coaching or know someone who is, please let us know at registration night. All teams must be submitted mid-September to SYS. Teams will not be registered to play unless there is a coach!

Season begins:

U6 – October 25, 2011, to play any day Mon to Fri, and one Sunday/month

U8 – October 23, 2011, to play Sunday and/or Sat (mainly Sundays)

U10 – October 25, 2011, to play Monday OR Thursdays (one or the other)

Season Ends: Mid March, 2012



Here are the age groupings and estimated fees for mini soccer this fall. At the time of printing, we do not know the soccer fees from SYSI and therefore FEES SUBJECT to CHANGE.

U6 – born during or after 2006 – \$70

U8 – born 2004/2005 – \$85 + \$50 uniform deposit (separate cheque please)

U10 – born 2002/2003 – \$145 + \$50 uniform deposit (separate cheque please)

Youth – born 2001 or later, must register with ZONE soccer (Lakewood soccer club)

There is a \$50 uniform deposit fee for U8 and U10 players. Please bring an extra cheque for this at your first practice. It will be returned if the uniform is returned in reusable condition on or before March 31, 2012. Your child will not be able to play until a deposit cheque is given.

Something you should know....

After registration night, we determine how many teams to enter into the league. Late entries and withdrawals require a lot more work for the volunteers and sometimes make it difficult to size the teams properly. If there are not enough kids to make a team or there is not a volunteer coach they could be placed on different community team. There is no guarantee your child will be placed on any team for late registrations.

If you are registering your child in a sport, please tell them to inform their friends so fewer people miss the registration night. Remember... www.lakeviewca.com

If your son or daughter is interested in playing Flag Football this fall, there will be a **ONE DAY ONLY** registration on **Monday, August 22, 2011** at **Lakeview School Library** from **7:00 pm to 8:30 pm**.

- Registration fee will be \$55.00 for the fall season.
- Please bring your child's health card number and be prepared to provide your child's jersey size
- An additional charge of \$10 will be added as Lakeview Community Association memberships will need to be renewed for the 2011/2012 year.
- Late registrations will not be accepted after August 22, 2011

Lakeview Community Association will be offering coed only teams this fall. (Maximum: 14 players per age group per team). Placement on teams will be made to Lakeview residents first. If not enough (or too many) kids for a team in a particular division, kids may be transferred to another nearby community association.

The fall league (which is 7 on 7) has games twice a week with one game on a week night and one on Saturday. The fall league begins Saturday, September 10th and goes until approximately Saturday, October 16th (ending with a weekend tournament). Games will not be held on Thanksgiving long weekend. **Times of games will be confirmed at a later date.**

- Colt Division : Grade 1 - 2 (Games on Monday & Saturday)
- Stampeder Division : Grade 3 - 4 (Games on Tuesday & Saturday)
- Hilltop Division : Grade 5 - 6 (Games on Wednesday & Saturday)
- Huskie Division : Grade 7 - 8 (Games on Thursday & Saturday)
- Rider Division: Grade 8-9 (Games on Thursday & Saturday)

Lakeview Community Basketball

Kids in the Lakeview area are invited to play basketball with the Lakeview Community Association this fall and winter. Participants play in age restricted divisions within the Saskatoon Minor Basketball Association (SMBA) league. Divisions are determined by grade or by age as of December 31. Teams are divided by gender, with the exception of Spuds, which are co-ed.



Typically practices begin late September or early October. Practice dates and times will depend on gym and coach availability. When registering please indicate which dates and time the registrant is unable to attend. This information will aid in determining teams. Practices are held weekdays, usually after 5:00 p.m., while games are played on Saturdays. League games begin mid October and continue until February. Some teams may advance to the championship tournament held in March. Updated game schedules are available at www.smba.ca

Due to the availability of gym space, coaches, number of registrations, and children’s schedules, it is sometimes necessary to have Lakeview residents play on teams in surrounding areas within the same SMBA zone.

According to SMBA regulations, all coaches are required to hold a minimum Level 1 technical coaching certificate. In addition, SMBA will perform security checks on coaches. Anyone interested in teaching skills and sportsmanship to Lakeview kids is encouraged to volunteer as a coach by calling the basketball co-ordinator, Todd Gursky, 477-1088.

Individual coaches and teams may decide to attend tournaments not linked to the SMBA schedule. Tournament costs will be arranged by the coaches and are in addition to the registrations paid to the Lakeview Community Association.

A separate \$50.00 uniform deposit (post-dated to May 1, 2012 and payable to Lakeview Community Association) must accompany each registration. People registering online can give the uniform deposit to their child’s coach.

Facility Rules and Regulations



- **Supervision** - Supervision of all children and young people’s activities is required in all areas of the school, it must be provided by the community association and the supervisor must be 18 years of age or older. The community association is responsible for the facility during the entire rental time, including spectators, siblings or other community people. If supervision has not arrived 15 minutes after the rental is scheduled to begin, the caretaker has authority to send the participants home.
- **Clean Up** – School facilities are to be left tidy and in the way in which they were found. Waste materials are to be collected and placed in containers provided by the caretaking staff.
- **Food/Drinks** – There are to be no outside food or drinks allowed in the school facilities.

2011 Multiple Sclerosis Residential Campaign

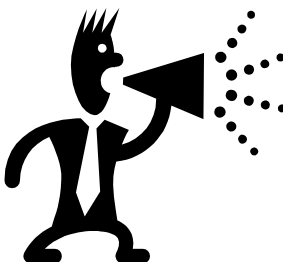
